TAAMB offers exhibits, programs, and community engagement for local students. The museum was founded in 2011 by Khalif and his wife, Victoria Rasshan. Both are retired teachers from the Pomona Unified School District.

TAAMB is located at 1460 E. Holt Ave, Suite 188, Pomona, CA. 91767. The facility is normally open Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, and on other days by appointment; however, the facility is currently closed to the public due to health concerns caused by Covid. Fortunately, Mr. Rasshan has agreed to share information about his work with the museum and with students with Division 80 members via Zoom.

Beverley Rouse nominated for coveted De Prida Award

Division 80's own Beverley Rouse has been nominated for CalRTA's coveted Ruth Q. De Prida Award.

The award honors an individual who has served the community with distinction, dedication, and



devotion as an educator and community leader; has served CalRTA with diligence; and exemplifies the qualities of unselfish readiness to further the cause of the organization. This award is the most prestigious honor that CalRTA offers to its members.

Beverley worked for CNUSD for 20 years, from August, 1996, until June, 2016, all of them at Lincoln Alternative School, which is now called Lincoln Fundamental School.


In addition to her work in the classroom, Beverley has a distinguished record of community service. She once served as the Chapter President of the National Association for the Education of Young Children (NAEYC), and as a leader and teacher for children's classes at her church.

Within CalRTA, Beverley has served as a Co-Vice President and Membership Chair, Vice President, and Directory Editor. She has also served on the Scholarship Committee.

Beverley's nomination for the De Prida Award is not the only recognition she has earned. She garnered the CTA "Who" Award in 2007 and the Zapara Award for Excellence in Teaching in 1991.

Beverley earned her Bachelor's degree in Sociology in 1972, and her Master's degree in Child Development in 1973, both from Washington State University.

Book Review Call Your Daughter Home



Call Your Daughter Home by Deb Spera (Park Row Books, 2019) is an expertly-told novel about life in a small Southern town in South Carolina in the 1920s, prior to the Depression.

The storyline is advanced through

first-person narratives of three narrators: Gertrude, who must take drastic actions to protect herself and her four daughters; Retta, a kind-hearted first-generation freed slave who comes to Gertrude's aid, despite objections from within her community; and Annie, the wife of the most influential man in town, but a man who hides a sickening secret.

The author weaves the stories of these three women together all the way to an unexpected and shocking conclusion. The reader will appreciate the book's themes of women's empowerment, motherhood, marriage, and rough justice.

Although this is a debut novel, the story is written so well it earned acclaim from *O Magazine* in 2019.


