Incident report needs to be filled out if you get hurt (by a student) these documentation needs to be kept so that district can follow what is going on with a student (this follows the student) This can be used by anyone that the student may injure. The district has an independent service keeping track of the data.

C. Treasurer's Report

The audit company of Smith-Marion & Co. is working with us; auditors will be here in October. More details at the next Rep. Council.

Unrestricted funds are at a surplus is now at \$229,034.96.

Our mortgage is down to \$756, 090.61

Monthly budget reflects our income of \$61,518.43 derived from line items 6110 to 6350.

Membership increased this year. We have 2502 teachers and 205 temp. specialist.

We are over budget by \$14,038.45, due to the fact that our figure sheets reflect the balance as of July 31, 2016 and our fiscal year ends in August.

We have a dues increase this year. CTA is up by \$12 annually, NEA is up by \$2 , for an annual increase of \$14, spread over 10 months calculates to \$1.40 difference over our 10 month pay periods.

The dues calculation was obtained from CTA.

Tonya Spencer (Elementary K-3 Director)

Reader by 9 is it mandatory or suggested

Assessments how are we going to get it done in the window, especially because of CEDLT

CEDLT testing window in some sites is shortened to 2 weeks

Computer logging off frequently, causing issues

Calendar, 1st Trimester is so much shorter, causing challenges.

Sites are scheduling staff meetings on Rep council days

Behavior issues (suspensions for kinder are not being implemented.)
Site specific issues with Kinder overlap
Sub pool, tiny and Edjoin is not open to new applicants.
Duty issues with Kinders
Teachers are being pulled from trainings due to sub shortages, but the application process on edjoin is not open
No compensation for duty is occurring at several sites.

Jennifer DeVries (Elementary 4-6 Director)

Online progress notes are not mandatory. CNTA Directors and Curriculum Directors sent a joint email to teachers to inform them.

CNTA does not approve the district assessment before they are administered.

5th grade teachers are not being told about NGSS state pilot test for this year.

6th grade teachers take 2 math assessments and one placement test, while 7th & 8th take one math assessment and one placement test, both are using CMP3 so why do 6th graders need to take one more assessment?

AVID concerns: 3 notebook checks a year, multiple supplies, point system, accuracy of planners and teachers are required to check and maintain these systems. Teachers also need to enter the data into illuminate. Teachers are concerned about the time, money and the validity of the data involved.

Angela Thomas (Support Service Director)

Nurses: only 12; one nurse has 7000 students and has already written 230 health action plans

Counselors: concerns that having to use Q for scheduling with glitches will present a problem in implementing in the upcoming year

SLPs: not enough of them; some schools starting without an SLP; need to hire more

Psychs: contracted people hired that are unable to perform the assigned tasks, ex. Unable to write an FBA; no support provided or not timely, discouraging them from asking; want to be given an opportunity to attend sped council and timecard; some timecards have not been accepted for additional hours

Teachers: multiple elementary schools are not getting the leadership team stipend to special education teachers on the team, lots of training offered for general education, but no new sped training

APE: want to be given an opportunity to attend sped council and timecard

DHH: none
